There were more out of spec cattle entered hence the average was depletes by a penny or two from last week at 174p/kg although including bulls.

Best bullocks saw handy weights selling to 229p/kg but with only 5 other selling at 200p/kg or above. Butchers heifers met an improved trade selling to 236p/kg on two occasions with two more above 230p/kg. More commercial cattle difficult to find homes. With the Jewish fraternity on Passover next week, this trend could sadly get worse, so please contact Mark Burgoyne if you have cattle to sell.

Farmers and food producers thinking of investing in their businesses could access discounted borrowing rates from the Agricultural Mortgage Corporation (AMC plc).

AMC has negotiated access to a £multi million European Investment Bank (EIB) fund aimed at stimulating investment and job creation in small and medium sized businesses, including those in farming. This means that loans for eligible projects can be discounted by 0.8% below normal rates for 10 years.

Local AMC agent Robert McCabe says this is an exciting development and means that loans for a wide range of farm and diversification projects such as building works, livestock housing and crop storage, farm shops and farm energy schemes can be heavily discounted.
