83 PRIME CATTLE

Tight on numbers once again, especially in the bull department. A firm trade throughout but no dearer than recent sales, as the forthcoming Easter Bank Holiday period disrupts trade. 18 cattle sold past 300p/kg with bulls over £2000 on three occasions.

A nice steer entry but with a few too many needing further finishing. Best steers sold to 313p/kg or £1784 in the lump.

Butchers' heifers topped at 336p/kg with 6 over or at 320p/kg. Heavy females sold to £1801.

Bull trade was sharp with more orders than bulls – similar story every Tuesday. Best suckler bulls sold to 290p/kg or £2139 in the body. Friesian bulls topped at 241p/kg with many more Black & Whites needed.

65 CLEAN CATTLE

10 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 273P/KG

A sweet black Limmie from Roger Jordin topped here at 313p/kg for 570kg with 'Mrs B' taking second spot for her 538kg Limmie at 310p/kg. John Cantrill sold his yearling Simmental Limmies to 272p/kg.

55 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 280P/KG

The Parkes family were top dog again selling their Blue to 336p/kg for 538kg with others to 320p/kg and 317p/kg. Andrew and Neale Dalton sold their shapey Limmie to 331p/kg with his second best to 328p/kg. Nigel Fieldhouse sold to 330p/kg for his handy weight Limousin early in the draw.

18 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 252P/KG

Desperately short of bulls once again with John Hewitt selling his 3 Limmies to a high of 290p/kg for 724kg to average £2085. Stabilisers from James Woolrich to 266p/kg for 718kg. Only a few Black & Whites sold to 241p/kg from the returning Colin Evans.

FARMING EQUIPMENT & TECHNOLOGY FUND GRANTS IN 2023

Grants for farmers, horticulturalists, forestry owners and contractors for specific items of equipment.

**ANIMAL HEALTH AND WELFARE – * NOW OPEN
UNTIL MIDDAY ON THURSDAY 15th JUNE***

The **Animal Health and Welfare** theme, which is now open, includes items such as:- mobile or fixed cattle handling systems, cattle crushes, head scoops, mobile or fixed sheep handling systems, weigh bars, electric fencing and ventilation fans.



The grants are for a minimum of £1,000 and maximum of £25,000 per theme, and are based on set grant amounts for each item. The grant element is usually around 40% of the item's cost, however if the price of the item you purchase results in the grant payment making up a lesser or greater percentage, this will not affect the amount of grant paid, so long as the requirements below are still met.

These requirements include all equipment which is purchased to meet the minimum specifications set out within the option guidance, to be brand new (ex-demo or second hand is not allowed) and purchased through a supplier or manufacturer. All items must also be paid for in full (part exchange is not allowed) and no items must be purchased before a grant funding agreement is offered, although it is possible to secure items with a refundable deposit if you are concerned about supply issues.

The application process is competitive with each item given a score, and applications with the highest average scores then being offered agreements.
