More cattle forward this morning saw a decent trade perhaps 2 to 3 pence per kilo dearer than last week's sale. Plenty of meat about generally, which was commented on by the buyers, and a better show of bulls both in terms of numbers and quality.

A decent show of steers with only perhaps one 'top notcher' sold to 316p/kg or £2013 in the lump.

Plenty of nicely presented heifers sold to a top of 358p/kg with a top price per head of £2003.

More bulls saw an improved trade, especially if they were properly meated. Best suckler bulls sold to 285p/kg or £2115 in the lump. Black & whites sold to 238p/kg.

Three cull cows sold to a top of 138p/kg for 586kg or £808.68.
