Similar cattle numbers but a strong level of demand from start to finish. There was a good yard of well-finished cattle put in front of buyers this morning and they were a real credit to all supporting producers. Thanks to all our farmers and buyers for their continued support and to all our staff for their hard work – don't be late in the morning!

Fewer steers penned saw a firm return, selling to high of 318p/kg on two occasions or £2060 in the lump. More could have easily been sold.

Apart from a few also rans, a great show of well-finished heifers. A high of 348p/kg was achieved or £1889 in the lump.

19 cattle sold to 300p/kg or above today. It was great to see a few more bulls but with many black & whites forward. Sucklers sold to 281p/kg or £1950, with black & whites to 239p/kg.

5 cull cows met a decent go with non-assured 824kg Limmies selling to 168p/kg or £1384, with more assured meated Herefords to 150p/kg for 762kg (£1143).
