93 PRIME CATTLE

Once again numbers were tight in all sections this morning, with bulls hard to find especially. A firm trade resulted but with some of the zip missing of recent sales. Smart, butcher's beasts saw a very competitive trade, with more commercial breaking cattle a little steadier in places.

More steers forward sold to a top of 302p/kg with heavy bullocks to £1860 in the lump.

Butcher's heifers topped at 323p/kg with 3 at 320p/kg or above. Heavy females sold to a high of £1830.40.

Bull trade was good from start to finish with continentals selling to 280p/kg or £1840 in the lump. A very good go on dairy bulls with square Black & Whites to 245p/kg.

Only 3 other cattle forward saw young Limousin cows to 195p/kg for 694kg (£1353) with bellied Friesian cows to 175p/kg for 692kg (£1211).

65 CLEAN CATTLE

17 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 249P/KG

Handyweight 514kg Limousins from Evan Watkin topped here at 302p/kg, with the best of Chris Jones' run of Lims to 291p/kg for 586kg. Overage Lims from John Rogers sailed to 288p/kg for 624kg. Heavy steers to £1859.76 for 756kg Blues from Brian & David Whiteman.

48 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 272P/KG

Evan Watkin cleaned up here also with his 530kg Limmie at 323p/kg, closely trailed by the Parkes brigade at 321p/kg for 550kg and 318p/kg for 514kg Lims. A great run from the Dalton stable sold to 320p/kg (x 2 for 572kg and 560kg, the heaviest being £1830.40). Other vendors hitting that magical 300p/kg figure, were Mrs B and Gaz Davies (and Sid of course – that will fill the piggy bank!)

28 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 242P/KG

Bill Yeomans dominated this section, selling his 610kg Limousin to 280p/kg and his 512kg model to 276p/kg. Blues from Joe Jarvis sailed to 271p/kg for 608kg. Hereford cross Friesians from Richard Yates went well to 249p/kg.

Friesians sold to 245p/kg for 590kg from Mrs B, with Holsteins often passing 220p/kg and plenty of customers for them.

Beltex hogs from Pete Morris 42kg over 300p/kg at 302p/kg and 39kg Texels from Josh Munday at 300p/kg. Cross-bred hogs 35kg to 248kg from John Ball and a run of lambs from Rob Rose to 244p/kg for 34kg, averaging 35.2kg and 240p/kg. Heavy hogs from Mark Meredith to £129.20 with a market average of £102, but hogs over 45.5kg only £4 dearer, averaging £106.20.

Farming Equipment & Technology Fund – Grants in 2023

Grants for farmers, horticulturalists, forestry owners and contractors for specific items of equipment.

This year, the grant has been split into 2 themes;

- **Productivity and Slurry - *NOW OPEN***
- **Animal Health and Welfare – Opening in March 2023**

Some of the items available under the Productivity and Slurry theme include;

The Animal Health and Welfare theme, which will open in March 2023, will include items such as:- mobile or fixed cattle handling systems, cattle crushes, head scoops, mobile or fixed sheep handling systems, weigh bars, electric fencing and ventilation fans.



The grants are for a minimum of £1,000 and maximum of £25,000 per theme, and are based on set grant amounts for each item. The grant element is usually around 40% of the item's cost, however if the price of the item you purchase results in the grant payment making up a lesser or greater percentage, this will not affect the amount of grant paid, so long as the requirements below are still met.

These requirements include all equipment which is purchased to meet the minimum specifications set out within the option guidance, to be brand new (ex-demo or second hand is not allowed) and purchased through a supplier or manufacturer. All items must also be paid for in full (part exchange is not allowed) and no items must be purchased before a grant funding agreement is offered, although it is possible to secure items with a refundable deposit if you are concerned about supply issues.

The application process is competitive with each item given a score, and applications with the highest average scores then being offered agreements.
