148 PRIME CATTLE

Producers who left the fields to sell cattle were well rewarded today, with trade at least as dear as last week. The whole market sold to average just short of 200p/kg, with many bottom end types included in the average. No doubt more could have easily found homes to advantage, with some buyers unable to fulfil orders.

There were only a handful of steers forward which sold to 246p/kg for the best. Best butchers heifers met tremendous demand selling to 250p/kg with buyers prepared to give 230p/kg struggling to get started. Second quality were very dear with many very fat for most tastes.

A much improved entry of bulls with a ring of men to take them. Shop bulls sold to 218p/kg with heavy sucklers to 206p/kg well over 400kg dead. Friesian bulls sold to 179p/kg. There were a lot of small, lean non FABBL and over 16 month bulls which all saw plenty of competition. Heavy Continentals sold to above £1500.

ONLY 5 COWS FORWARD

Plenty of need but nowhere near enough forward. Lean Limousins sold to 124p/kg from Mark Nash, with meaty Blondes to 135p/kg from Bill Yeomans.

71 CLEAN CATTLE

Only 10 steers forward sold to average 175p/kg. James Woolrich headed this department with his 550kg Limousin cross sold after strong bidding at 246p/kg. James also sold to 228p/kg and 220p/kg for 666kg. Herefords sold to 152p/kg from James Lee with his Friesians to 152p/kg.

73 heifers sold to average 202p/kg. A superstar Blonde from Robert Beaman sold 250p/kg for 576kg. Other Blonde at 494kg achieved 243p/kg from Charlie Cadwallader. Blues from the Chilton stable sold to 240p/kg for 470kg. Blues and Lims from Richard Parkes sold to 242p/kg and 241p/kg, both above 500kg. Why sell deadweight when you can achieve these prices and help drive beef prices forward?

77 YOUNG BULLS OV. AV. 165P/KG

The average belies a super trade with a very pleasing number penned this morning. As stated before, there were plenty of bidders for all ages and qualities.

Handy Limousins sold to 218p/kg for 472kg from Craig Evans, with his 616kg model to 200p/kg. Heavy bulls found new customers selling to 206p/kg for 732kg Limousin from Matt Bower. Rob Stubbs sold to 191p/kg for 762kg.

Square, well-finished black and whites sold to 179p/kg for David Evans at 578kg, with Mary Beaumont achieving 177p/kg in lot 1.

Scant consolation trade in Bridgnorth firmer than most to average 157p/kg and best, well-finished sheep sought after and selling to 188p/kg and £81.90.

Heavy weight lambs to 166p/kg to 47kg from Steve Jones, with most realising £73 to £78. As you would expect, very few light lambs selling to 163p/kg for 33.5kg.
