Decent numbers of clean cattle forward today, but with depleted bull entries. The edge was taken a little off some of this trade today as several abattoirs and cutting plants had reported staff shortages and breakdowns. Selling the beef is not an issue, as long as you are able to process it! New buyers in attendance for heavy bulls and steers — they will be looking for cattle next week.

Not a bad show of steers but with only two best sorts selling to 276p/kg. Heavy steers sold to £1830 in the lump.

Best butchers' heifers held their own with five above the magic 300p/kg figure, to a top of 312p/kg. Heavy females sold to £1718 in the lump. A small show of bulls with trade a little slower here generally, but with heavier, better-quality types in strongest demand to 263p/kg or nearly £1900 in the lump. Dairy bulls to 214p/kg.

Two cows forward saw young Blues selling to 160p/kg for 638kg

A smaller entry for this year's May Fair, a reflection of the TB restrictions. Trevor Breakwell's herd dispersal attracting customers from several adjoining counties and a selection of suckler-bred stores creating interest, selling to over 300p/kg and heavier dairy-bred steers to £1460.

Cows and calves peaked at £1650 for an 8-year-old Limousin cow and her 6 month-old calf from Will Westwood.

Trevor Breakwell's cows and calves sold to £1920, with 11-year-old Limousins, running with the bull, selling to £1160. Limousin stock bull of 7 years old sold at £3100 and a 4 year-old Angus stock bull sold to £1500.

The annual consignment from Roger and Jason Payton sold to 303p/kg, closely followed by Chris Walkers 355kg Limousin steers 299p/kg. Heavier more traditional breeds over 250p/kg for 400kg Hereford steers from Julian Radcliffe.

Stronger dairy and continental steers sold to £1460 from Steve Lewis, whose entry averaged £1271, and smaller 380kg suckler-bred steers from Chris Walker sold at £1065.

Heifers sold to £1070 at 435kg Charolais and British Blues from Derek Price to £1040 23 month-old average just shy of £1000. 14 month-old Angus heifers from James Radcliffe not quite £1000 at £980, and Roger Payton 410kg Limmos at £1010.

Generally suckler heifers over 250p/kg to 260p/kg, Blondes 375kg from Chris Walker, Devon heifers 10 months-old (300kg) at 242p/kg and Angus to 236p/kg.
