196 PRIME CATTLE

Trade gets no better but is just about holding its own. Once again best sorts found keener bidders whereas over fat cattle were difficult to prop. With over the counter demand very slow, buyers are very selective at the moment. With this in mind, there are plenty of beasts better suited in the store ring. Half-meated cattle, especially if non-assured are pounds better off in the stores.

A good number of steers forward saw the best shapes to 227p/kg for 688kg or £1561 in the lump. There were very few best butchers heifers penned as the best were mostly too heavy for most requirements. Top price 235p/kg or £1311.30.

Bull trade a little firmer, with plenty of buyers for our varied sample. Best young suckler bulls sold to 220p/kg or £1424 as a lump. Good fleshed square Friesians sold to 188p/kg with Holsteins to 165p/kg.

17 COWS & 1 STOCK BULL

Too few cows to satisfy over buyers. A handful of very best cows sold to 175p/kg for 852kg Blondes. 680kg Holsteins with meat sold to 110p/kg. Plain cows sold from 50p/kg to 86p/kg. Limousin stock bulls sold to 127p/kg or £1257.

127 CLEAN CATTLE

59 steers sold to average 180p/kg. A superb British Blue from Ed Green stole this department at 227p/kg. Two Blondes from Frank Millichamp sold to 219p/kg and 217p/kg for 636kg and 586kg, with 566kg Lims to 214p/kg from Gordon Jones. Plenty of demand for steers over 30 months of age, selling about 5-10p/kg below UTM price generally. Holstein steers with meat and Red Tractor occasionally passed 160p/kg.

68 heifers sold to average 188p/kg. A superb run from New House Farm once again sold to 235p/kg and 230p/kg for 558kg and 568kg Lims and Blues. 522kg Lims sold to 229p/kg from Craig Evans. Ed Roberts' run of leaner handy weights sold to 227p/kg for 496kg Limmies.

69 BULLS SOLD OV AV. 156P/KG

Our entry includes 48 Holsteins, Friesians, Ayrshires etc. and 35 bulls over 16 months of age. Ed Green, having excelled with his steers topped the bulls at 220p/kg for 646kg Limousin. Blondes from Brian Watkins sold to 214p/kg for 564kg, with other Blondes to 212p/kg for 672kg from Charlie Cadwallader.

A super run of black and whites from Mary Beaumont sold to 188p/kg and 176p/kg with heavier Holsteins to 167p/kg from James Woolrich.
