Similar numbers saw trade holding its own, with well fleshed cattle sought after. It really does pay to get your cattle fit — you probably cannot get them too fat! 100 cattle are needed each Tuesday to help supply our regular buying support.

Just in double figures of steers with some decent meated sorts sold to a high of 306p/kg with heavies to £2028 in the lump.

Once again some tidy heifers penned today selling to a top of 345p/kg for handyish weights with £1956 per head top call in the lump.

A better sample of bulls sold to a top of 295p/kg or £1947 as a whole. Some better finished black & whites topped at 236p/kg.

One plain, small non-assured Hereford x cow sold to 78p/kg.

57 CLEAN CATTLE

10 STEERS SOLD TO OV AV 283P/KG

Handyweight 534kg red Limmies from Harvey Parkes topped here at 306p/kg, closely followed by Mrs B selling a nice run of steers to 304p/kg for 606kg. Rob Whiteman sold his thumping 780kg Blue-cross Friesian to £2028 (260p/kg) with David Whiteman selling a similar beast to £2015.36 for 752kg (268p/kg).

47 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV AV 285P/KG

A great show of the usual quality from the Parkes family stole the honours here at 345p/kg, 344p/kg and 340p/kg, for just above half a ton Limousins. Mrs B was well worth noting again with her black Limmie sellings to 342p/kg for 572kg (£1956.24). Richard Skellern sold his 622kg Limmie to 314p/kg or £1953.08.

21 BULLS SOLD TO OV AV 252P/KG

A great Limousin bull saw Richard Skellern in the pound seats again, selling to 295p/kg for 660kg (£1947), with Bill Yeomans best to 286p/kg for 626kg. Richard Povall's run of three Lims took third spot here at 284p/kg for 566kg.

562kg Friesians from Roger Rowson topped the dairy bulls at 236p/kg, with Mark Lloyd selling his Holsteins to 228p/kg and 227p/kg.
