Similar numbers penned today met a sharp trade from start to finish, with some well finished cattle sought after by our ringside of buying customers. Very few best steers forward but there were some useful heifers and a tidy bull here and there. 23 clean cattle sold to or above 300p/kg today.

Handy weight steers topped at 304p/kg with heavy dairy bred steers to £1959 in the lump.

Heifers sailed to 340p/kg on two occasions with heavy heifers to £2022 with several past £1900.

No let up in the bull department saw Continental suckler bulls selling to 283p/kg with Hereford cross bulls adding up well to £1972.48. Black and Whites sold to a high of 228p/kg.

6 cows met a great go with slip Blues selling to 200p/kg with other young cows to £1421.

Marcus Whitehouse headed this section with his half ton Angus steer selling to 304p/kg. There were no other suckler steers, so Brian and Dave Whiteman's dairy bull took second spot at 248p/kg for 790kg or £1959.20 as a whole.

A great run from Harvey Parkes and family topped the day at 340p/kg for two Limmies around that 500kg mark, with 'Mrs B' selling her best Blue cross Shorthorns to 324p/kg and 321p/kg. Cross bred ewes to £154, Suffolk x Mules £140 and heavy Mules over £120 to £125.


Strong lean ewes very dear with, as recent weeks, shapey lean ewes the dearest per pound with very lean Texel and Suffolk ewes well over £100.

The Animal Health and Welfare theme, which will open in March 2023, will include items such as:- mobile or fixed cattle handling systems, cattle crushes, head scoops, mobile or fixed sheep handling systems, weigh bars, electric fencing and ventilation fans.



The grants are for a minimum of £1,000 and maximum of £25,000 per theme, and are based on set grant amounts for each item. The grant element is usually around 40% of the item's cost, however if the price of the item you purchase results in the grant payment making up a lesser or greater percentage, this will not affect the amount of grant paid, so long as the requirements below are still met.

These requirements include all equipment which is purchased to meet the minimum specifications set out within the option guidance, to be brand new (ex-demo or second hand is not allowed) and purchased through a supplier or manufacturer. All items must also be paid for in full (part exchange is not allowed) and no items must be purchased before a grant funding agreement is offered, although it is possible to secure items with a refundable deposit if you are concerned about supply issues.

The application process is competitive with each item given a score, and applications with the highest average scores then being offered agreements.
