## WEEKLY REPORT – 21.02.23



### 62 PRIME CATTLE

Very disappointing numbers this morning, but all vendors were well rewarded with a flying trade from start to finish. Clean cattle, bulls and cows were in strong demand with an overall market average of 268p/kg!

Steer numbers were depleted, but sold above expectation to 283p/kg, with heavier bullocks to £1994.

12 heifers sold on or above 300p/kg with a top of 330p/kg, with over thirty females selling to £1865.16 in the lump.

The bull drought continues, but a belting trade on the lot. Best suckler bulls were thin on the ground, but Angus crosses sold to 280p/kg or £2105 in the lump. Black & Whites sold to 232p/kg or £1438.80 in the lump.

Two cows and one 47 month old steer sold to an exceptional trade, with 692kg meat-Limmie crosses hitting 190p/kg, with 832kg Herefords to £1456. Plain steers added up nicely at £883 for 566kg.

#### 9 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 270P/KG

A super run of 33-month-old Limousins from John Rogers topped at 283p/kg for 640kg, with Mrs B in second spot at 280p/kg for 560kg. A great run of well-finished, dairy-bred bullocks from Dave & Brian Whiteman sold to a flying trade to a top of £1993.92 for 744kg.

The usual quality from the Parkes gang topped again at 330p/kg for 532kg British Blue with 518kg Limousins to 322p/kg from the same home. Charlie Sandells took the bronze medal position at 320p/kg for his half tonne, home-bred model with 540kg Blondes to 316p/kg from the Dalton stable. John Rogers headed the day here also with his 628kg stacking up to £1865.16.

Once again a very similar trade to last week, very much a two-tier sale with finished hoggs easily sold, whereas leaner sorts proved harder work.

More interest in the best sheep selling to 286p/kg for Texels weighing 44kg from Rob Jones and heavier hoggs of 47kg to 265p/kg. Several pens of 40kg to 44kg sheep sold to 260p/kg to 277p/kg with heavy hoggs of 62kg selling to £138.25.

Hoggs under 40kg were a mixed trade, which was a reflection of breeds and finish. Texel types from Rhys Perkins topped out at 246p/kg. Continental crosses from Rob Rose were 235p/kg, with more hill breeds at 205p/kg to 215p/kg.

Seven purchasers present with bidding quite frantic, Texel ewes took top spot at £178 from Neil Ellis, with £141 for Texel x Suffolk crosses, £139 for Suffolks and North Country Mules were much dearer at £126.

Plainer, lowland ewes sold for £110 for Suffolks, Mules £80, ugly, fat ewes sold to £119. Smaller ewes sold for £126 for Cheviots and £65 for improved Welsh.

#### 102 STORE CATTLE

Trade took a leap forward again and there was nowhere near enough cattle to satisfy demand. Quality sorts were very thin on the ground, with suckler bred heifers selling to 317p/kg with suckler steers to 297p/kg. No store above half a tonne today, saw Limousin crosses selling to £1320 with Hereford steers to £1150. Outlying British Blue steers sold to £1140. A Hereford bull (24m) sold to £1220 and grazing cows sold to £1250 for Hereford crosses.

The Animal Health and Welfare theme, which will open in March 2023, will include items such as:- mobile or fixed cattle handling systems, cattle crushes, head scoops, mobile or fixed sheep handling systems, weigh bars, electric fencing and ventilation fans.



The grants are for a minimum of £1,000 and maximum of £25,000 per theme, and are based on set grant amounts for each item. The grant element is usually around 40% of the item's cost, however if the price of the item you purchase results in the grant payment making up a lesser or greater percentage, this will not affect the amount of grant paid, so long as the requirements below are still met.

These requirements include all equipment which is purchased to meet the minimum specifications set out within the option guidance, to be brand new (ex-demo or second hand is not allowed) and purchased through a supplier or manufacturer. All items must also be paid for in full (part exchange is not allowed) and no items must be purchased before a grant funding agreement is offered, although it is possible to secure items with a refundable deposit if you are concerned about supply issues.

The application process is competitive with each item given a score, and applications with the highest average scores then being offered agreements.
