Trade goes from strength to strength with lack of supply keeping prices firm, alongside the beef sales remaining strong. This is what can happen when true market forces are at play and control is relinquished by the 'big boys'! 21 cattle sold from 300p/kg and above today.

A useful steer entry saw some top notchers selling to 309p/kg or £2137.12 in the lump.

Some great heifers, as recent sales, sold to a high of 338p/kg with 3 others above 330p/kg. Heavy females sold well to £1956.

Bull numbers remain very tight everywhere and a mixed show sold to a very sharp trade although Continentals topped at 285p/kg or £1810 in the lump. There were no best heavy types penned today. A cracking Holstein Friesian trade topped at 232p/kg.

A small sample of four mainly plainish barrens sold above expectations to 179p/kg or £1220.78 in the lump.

The few stronger cattle penned were headed by Andrew Penny's Hereford steers selling to £1290 at 23m with slightly smaller red Herefords to £1170 from Joe Birch at 26m. Dairy bred Angus steers from the Birch's once again topped at £1100 at 26m, with Friesians to £865 from Max Ossig.

The Animal Health and Welfare theme, which will open in March 2023, will include items such as:- mobile or fixed cattle handling systems, cattle crushes, head scoops, mobile or fixed sheep handling systems, weigh bars, electric fencing and ventilation fans.





The grants are for a minimum of £1,000 and maximum of £25,000 per theme, and are based on set grant amounts for each item. The grant element is usually around 40% of the item's cost, however if the price of the item you purchase results in the grant payment making up a lesser or greater percentage, this will not affect the amount of grant paid, so long as the requirements below are still met.

These requirements include all equipment which is purchased to meet the minimum specifications set out within the option guidance, to be brand new (ex-demo or second hand is not allowed) and purchased through a supplier or manufacturer. All items must also be paid for in full (part exchange is not allowed) and no items must be purchased before a grant funding agreement is offered, although it is possible to secure items with a refundable deposit if you are concerned about supply issues.

The application process is competitive with each item given a score, and applications with the highest average scores then being offered agreements.
