Trade lacked a little bite today but with some quality sorts boosting averages. A few butchers were missing but commercial sorts held their values more easily. There were several runs of leaner sorts as producers made room for the imminent barley harvest.

More steers penned this morning sold to a top of 291p/kg or £1815 in the lump. Well finished steers were a firm trade throughout.

9 heifers above that magic 300p/kg figure to a high of 310p/kg. Heavy heifers were in very short supply as farmers try to get them away quickly and sold to £1659 in the lump.

Bull trade a little easier not helped by some tail end Holsteins. Best sucklers sold pretty well to 269p/kg or £1834 in the lump. Black and White dairy bulls with finish sold easily to 214p/kg – plainer brethren harder work. One plain British Blue cow sold to 130p/kg for 774kg.

27 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 238P/KG

A star of a Limmie from Evans, Curdale sailed to 291p/kg for 624kg or £1815.84. 628kg Limmies from 'Mrs B' took second spot at 281p/kg with two from William Rodenhurst selling to 275p/kg and 274p/kg. 738kg Limmies from Dave Preece stacked up tidily to £1793.34.

53 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 260P/KG

Evans, Curdale 'cleaned up' in this department also at 310p/kg for 516kg plummy Lim heifer. Andrew Bishop, Neil Perkins and Evans, Curdale all sold to 306p/kg with Perkins and Curdale also achieving 305p/kg. The Bishop's second heifer hit 303p/kg with 'Mrs B' and Curdale hitting 300p/kg. Charolais crosses from that 'deserving cause' sold to £1658.80 for 580kg. More fit, well conformed heavy heifers required please.

40 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 218P/KG

The Continental bulls were headed by the Kirton family at 269p/kg for 652kg with their 722kg bull selling to £1833.88 whilst on an away-day Michael Halford sold one of a pair to 255p/kg. Richard Yates sold his best Limmie to 253p/kg for 594kg.

Black and Whites bulls topped at 214p/kg for 616kg from Bob Mayer with his two Flekvieh bulls to 224p/kg.
