Disappointing numbers this morning with some wholesalers seeing sales a little slower but a firm trade resulted from start to finish. More of a mix of types forward with a very sharp trade on handyweights with shape. 14 cattle sold to 300p/kg and above.

A small entry of steers saw a high of 292p/kg with heavier bullocks to £1776 in the lump.

Butchers' heifers sailed to 352p/kg with a second at 350p/kg, with £2028 top call as a body.

Bull trade possibly a little easier but with a high of 304p/kg or £2134 in the lump. Black & White bulls topped at 237p/kg but were harder to sell generally.

7 cows forward met a level trade selling to 182p/kg for 950kg thick Hereford cow (£1729). Good numbers of cows required each week.

A well-finished Limmie from John Cantrill sold to 292p/kg to top this department, with handy 496kg Simmental crosses selling to 283p/kg from Mrs B. Chris Jones sold his best Limmie to 280p/kg for 593kg.

39 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 288P/KG

The Parkes family probably did not have their very best run today but still recorded 352p/kg for 532kg, with others to 342p/kg and 334p/kg from the same stable. 508kg Limmies from Roger Jordin took the silver medal position at 350p/kg. John Hewitt sold his homebred Limousin to 336p/kg for 454kg. Tony Barker and Mrs B both exceeded 320p/kg and are well worth a mention. Sam Jones sold his 704kg Limousin to add up to £2027.52 – above expectation Mr Jones!

These requirements include all equipment which is purchased to meet the minimum specifications set out within the option guidance, to be brand new (ex-demo or second hand is not allowed) and purchased through a supplier or manufacturer. All items must also be paid for in full (part exchange is not allowed) and no items must be purchased before a grant funding agreement is offered, although it is possible to secure items with a refundable deposit if you are concerned about supply issues.

The application process is competitive with each item given a score, and applications with the highest average scores then being offered agreements.
