A great show of cattle with some quality sorts forward – especially in the heifer department. Very best cattle maintained their values but with trade appearing to plateau at the moment, with butchers and wholesalers reporting slower sales generally.

A handful more steers penned this morning saw very best finished bullocks selling well to 227p/kg or £1348 in the lump. Cattle shown a little too soon were more difficult.

Again heifers were a fantastic sample and sold accordingly to 259p/kg with several above 240p/kg. A firm trade on heavy heifers selling to £1463 in the lump.

Bull trade held its own with best handy weight Continental bulls to 222p/kg. Plenty of heavy sucklers forward selling to £1451 at 21 months. Again, not too many black and whites which were in decent demand at 168p/kg with well finished Holsteins above £1000 on occasions.

4 CULL COWS & 1 STOCK BULL

990kg Blonde x cows sold to 138p/kg or £1366 in the lump with non-assured Limousin crosses to 123p/kg for 722kg. Lean Blonde stock bull to 110p/kg for 904kg.

OBITUARY ROBIN NETTLETON

As a young Yorkshireman Robin travelled to Bridgnorth in 1960, aged 16 to take up a post as an articled clerk with Nock Deighton. The intention at the time was to train as a land agent and surveyor prior to returning home where there was the prospect of involvement in the family farming business. His career developed following his success as a pupil to the extent that he worked across the full range of services provided by Nock Deighton from auctioneering of livestock, deadstock and property to professional instructions and estate agency. He went on to spend his whole career with the firm eventually becoming "the boss".

On Robin's arrival in Bridgnorth, he not only joined Nock Deighton but also the towns Cricket and Hockey Club. Again his career and involvement with the club would span the remainder of his lifetime. He played hockey into his 60's and became President when advancing years were taking too heavy a toll on his joints!

The Rotary Club in Bridgnorth was another beneficiary of Robin's attentions and as a long term member he held a number of posts within the club seldom seeking the limelight but with a core group of members and friends he assisted in many fundraising events while enjoying the fellowship and friendship of other like-minded people.

Robin became a senior figure in Nock Deighton after establishing his credentials and developed particularly the estate agency business through a period of growth including the recessions of the 1970's and 1980's. Opportunities for expansion were taken so that this aspect of the business had a presence in Bridgnorth, Ludlow, Ironbridge and the County town of Shrewsbury. During this period, the livestock market in Bridgnorth town centre alongside many other markets across the country came under increasing pressure for change and opportunity for the site owner to sell out to the burgeoning supermarket chains. A deal was done to sell the site and this inevitably led to the potential loss of the livestock market to the town. It was Robin's energy, ability and determination when faced with very little time prior to the market closure which secured the site, planning permission and funding to develop the existing Livestock and Auction Centre at Tasley. Without this and the project management of Michael Walters who Robin appointed with the promise of a partnership, this facility would have been lost to the town.

Robin recently explained that he had operated as a "benevolent dictator" throughout much of his career. By this approach, the current partners in Nock Deighton Agricultural LLP have benefitted from his vision and by extension the wider farming community and Bridgnorth town by the continuance of a facility that could easily have been lost.
