#### 99 PRIME CATTLE

A few less cattle forward as trade struggles to hold its own and the forthcoming Bank Holidays disrupting the normal flow of business. Trade was definitely no worse and there were a few more leaner sorts about generally.

A decent show of steers with the leanest non-assured standing up to £1718 in the lump. Very few top end bullocks with 285p/kg top dollar for these.

Seven heifers sold on or above the magic 300p/kg figure to highs of 316p/kg on two occasions. Handyweight heifers sold to £1643.42 (520kg).

Disappointing bull numbers, but unsurprising as feed prices soar month by month. Very best suckler bulls were almost non-existent with Blues selling to 256p/kg with heavier Continentals to £1714 in the lump. A small sample of Black and Whites sold to 203p/kg.

#### 11 COWS AND 1 STOCK BULL

A GREAT ENTRY HERE WITH A HERD DISPERSAL NEARLY COMPLETE FROM ROGER GOODE. Limousin cross cows sold to 186p/kg for 778kg from Bagginswood with younger Devon slips selling to the same from Harold and Robert Pugh. Top price per head £1447.08 from Rogers, Bagginswood. 844kg Limousin stock bull sold well to 159p/kg or £1341.96 again from the Rogers stable.

With a new customer present for heavy hoggs, trade on hoggs over 46kg could have been as good as any week selling to £160 and 282p/kg for 45kg clipped hoggs.

Meated hoggs regardless of weight generally 260p/kg to 270p/kg with weight most sought after. Lighter hoggs lacked quality with 36.5kg hoggs to 266p/kg and most 240p/kg to 260p/kg.
