

# BRIDGNORTH LIVESTOCK MARKET

## WEEKLY REPORT – 26.03.19



### 184 PRIME CATTLE

#### Auctioneer – Mark Burgoyne 07831 192603

Large numbers forward met a firm trades with more second quality sorts forward. However, most of the cattle were well-meated and saw plenty of bidding from start to finish. Obviously, very heavy or shapeless cattle were difficult to place.

Not too many steers penned this morning sold to 217p/kg, with the best well in front of dead quotes for the week and to £1418 in the lump.

Fewer best heifers around the 500kg mark forward but with more females under 460kg and over 550kg. 346p/kg was best price achieved today, with heavier sorts standing up quite favourably up to £1365 in the lump.

A mixed bag of bulls with a few more suckler sorts born last spring being marketed but several “tail end Charlie” Holsteins also. Suckler bulls sold to 215p/kg or £1369, with a large black and white contingent selling to 174p/kg and £1115 in the lump.

**ONLY 3 COWS** forward met a decent go with 758kg Blondes selling to 129p/kg or £977.82, with fat Angus cows to 109p/kg for 848kg.

### 112 CLEAN CATTLE

**24 Steers sold to ov.av.184p/kg** – Chris Davies’ Limousin steers topped this section at 217p/kg for 618kg, with his 592kg steer to 209p/kg. Long distance travellers sold to 213p/kg from Llyr Jones & Family at 666kg, adding up nicely at £1418.58, with his second steer to £1400.80. Charolais crosses sold to 195p/kg for a “very deserving cause” at 668kg.

**88 Heifers sold to ov.av. 198p/kg** – A shapey British Blue from Peter Hartley stole the headlines at 246p/kg, with Richard Parkes’ Blue selling to 244p/kg for 474kg, closely followed by Dave Chilton selling 480kg Limmies to 242p/kg. Other notable candidates were Brian Watkins (Happy Birthday Dan – you look well on it!) selling Blondes 482kg to 239p/kg, with Roger Jordin selling 532kg to 238p/kg, with his Charolais to £1364.84.

### 72 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 167P/KG

Ed Green’s quality Blues headed here at 215p/kg for 614kg, with his 640kg Blue to 214p/kg (£1369.60). Brian Watkins’ Blonde sailed to 214p/kg for 574kg, with Pete & Rob Hartley’s Blues to 213p/kg for 580kg.

620kg well-finished Friesians sold to 174p/kg from James Woolrich, with Dave Preece’s heavy black and whites to £1115.92 and £1114.56.
