### 108 PRIME CATTLE

It was very pleasing to see a few more cattle forward this morning, especially in the bull department. A very sharp trade from start to finish with more cattle needed to satisfy orders. Best clean cattle sold to a high of 335p/kg with steers over the £2,000 mark once again.

A small handful of steers forward sold to a high of 304p/kg with heavies sailing to £2059 in the lump.

Our heifer show was superb in places but with all meaty cattle seeing a good trade. Best butcher's types topped at 335p/kg and heavy females to £1909.

Best suckler bulls in short supply again and sold to 268p/kg with heavy bulls to £2077 in the lump. A great trade on Black & Whites selling to 227p/kg with Holstein topping at £1540 in the lump.

One meaty Simmental cross cow sold to 170p/kg for 782kg.

### 60 CLEAN CATTLE

#### 6 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 279P/KG

A cracking handyweight Limousin from Marcus Whitehouse topped at 304p/kg for 458kg, with a snorting 720kg Blonde from Millichamp Bros selling to 286p/kg (£2059.20) and their 762kg Blonde to £2049.78. Rob Pugh sold his Devon steer to 285p/kg for 658kg.

#### 54 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 279P/KG

Evans Curdale showed five 'stunners' this morning, selling their cream to 335p/kg for 532kg, with others to 324p/kg on two occasions. The Parkes family had a great day also selling two Limmies to 330p/kg and a third to 329p/kg. 482kg Limousins from Marcus Whitehouse again sold to a creditable 323p/kg with his half-tonner to 320p/kg. Robert & Pete Hartley, Rob Pugh and Mrs B also sold 300p/kg plus 740kg Blue crosses stacked up well at £1909.20 from David Whiteman.

#### 48 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 235P/KG

Handyweight home-bred sucklers from Howard & Colin Fish headed the day at 268p/kg and 266p/kg for 510kg & 536kg, with heavier 716kg Lims from Dave Jones selling to 267p/kg. Rob & Peter Hartley's run topped at 266p/kg for 596kg at 12 months old. 802kg Lims from the Jones stable again stacked up nicely at £2077.18. Hereford crosses to 246p/kg from Lee Preece.

A great day for Black & White vendors with Dave Preece selling his neat Friesian to 227p/kg for 622kg (£1411.94) with Charlie Lloyd selling to 223p/kg and Charlie Cadwallader 700kg Holstein realising £1540.

An improved hogg trade with an overall sale average of 235p/kg including all shapes and sizes.

Best sheep as in recent weeks showing a very sharp trade over 300p/kg this week to 307p/kg for Texel and hoggs from Richard Morgan 46.5kg and £142.76.

Reports that London Smithfield this morning was awash with Southern Hemisphere lamb meant that the heavier hoggs proved harder to sell with many 40kg to 44kg hoggs realising more per head than sheep 10kg heavier.

Lighter hoggs however showed vast improvement with commercial 36kg sheep to 247p/kg from Rob Rose. Hoggs over 50kg to 282p/kg for an exceptional pen of 55.5kg Texels from Richard Morgan, otherwise most traded 210p/kg to 220p/kg.

The Animal Health and Welfare theme, which will open in March 2023, will include items such as:- mobile or fixed cattle handling systems, cattle crushes, head scoops, mobile or fixed sheep handling systems, weigh bars, electric fencing and ventilation fans.



The grants are for a minimum of £1,000 and maximum of £25,000 per theme, and are based on set grant amounts for each item. The grant element is usually around 40% of the item's cost, however if the price of the item you purchase results in the grant payment making up a lesser or greater percentage, this will not affect the amount of grant paid, so long as the requirements below are still met.

These requirements include all equipment which is purchased to meet the minimum specifications set out within the option guidance, to be brand new (ex-demo or second hand is not allowed) and purchased through a supplier or manufacturer. All items must also be paid for in full (part exchange is not allowed) and no items must be purchased before a grant funding agreement is offered, although it is possible to secure items with a refundable deposit if you are concerned about supply issues.

The application process is competitive with each item given a score, and applications with the highest average scores then being offered agreements.
