A small Platinum Jubilee week's entry saw demand steady, with clean trade holding its own and a cooler breeze in the bull section. We are anticipating normal trading next week as buyers look to restock after the Bank Holiday weekend.

There were some well-fleshed steers forward this morning which sold to 278p/kg or £1902 in the lump. Some useful butcher's heifers penned sold to a high of 296p/kg with seven cattle 290 pence a kilo plus.

A small bull entry with bull buyers switched off. Best lean Blonde bulls toped at 248p/kg or to £1731 in the lump.

Six cows this morning met a dear trade with under thirty month-old slips selling to 207p/kg with older Hereford cross Friesians to 176p/kg for 716kg. Non-assured Angus cows sold to £1431.40.



A larger entry with trade improving towards the end of last week, averaging 352p/kg and over £140 per head with a top price per kilo of 377p/kg and £185.90 per head.

The best lambs would be no dearer than recent weeks, however the more commercial lambs experienced a significant rise in value. Heavy lambs to £185.90 from Adrian Bradley, whose entry averaged £162.50. Too many pens to mention realised over £190, with well-fleshed lambs easily sold regardless of weight. A top price per kilo of 277p/kg for 40kg Texel lambs from Richard Parkes with lambs from Pete Kirton, Graham Davies and Luke Price over 370p/kg. Commercial export-weight lambs looked very well sold, with most 345p/kg to 355p/kg and light weights keenly sought after, with 31.5 kg to 355p/kg from Paul Lawley.

With hoggs drying up nationally remarkably 1249 hoggs were penned of every size shape and condition. Almost at the end of the season the £200 barrier was surpassed with 80kg Blue Texel at £206.40 from Tony England!

The entire entry averaged 250p/kg and just shy of £120 per head, with hoggs trading at 290p/kg, falling shy of top spot by 30p/kg, 48kg from Luke price at 320p/kg and several pens of 48.5kg hoggs from Nigel Kinsey at 308p/kg. As last week, heavy hoggs were easily sold, the heavier the better with 17 pens from Gordon Poyner - made up of several different breeds - averaging £130 a head, weighing 46.5kg and almost 280p/kg. Light hoggs to 268p/kg from Rob Rose, who presented 120 hoggs of breeds even Gordon Poyner has never owned, weighing 34kg and selling to possibly his trade of the season.
