Best Limmie cows from Thomas Cefnmystrych sold at a high of 233p/kg with his 770kg cow at 229p/kg or £1763.20 in the lump. 715kg Lims from Davies Waunllanau Isaf hit 212p/kg with Williams Penralltfangor selling his best to 204p/kg for 785kg (£1601.40). A nice run of Charolais and Simmental cows from Blaenpant Farms topped at 203p/kg for 725kg.

Meaty dairy types were hard to find today and sold well to 182p/kg for 705kg from Jones Garreg Goch with others to 178p/kg from James Blaenau Bach.

Plainer cows a sharp trade usually around 110-130p/kg plus.

Prime steers sold to 206p/kg for 580kg from Williams Trelewyd.
